

# THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF GODERICH BY-LAW NO. 23 OF 1994

A by-law to prohibit the obstruction of streets and boulevards with snow in the said Town.

---

**WHEREAS** pursuant to the Provisions of Section 102 of the Municipal Act R.S.O. 1990, Chapter M45, the Council of every municipality may pass by-laws and make such regulations for the health, safety, morality and welfare of the inhabitants of the municipalities in matters not specifically provided for by the Municipal Act and as may be expedient and are not contrary to law.

**AND WHEREAS** it is deemed expedient to pass a by-law prohibiting the obstructions of streets and boulevards.

**NOW, THEREFORE, THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF GODERICH ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:**

1. For the purpose of this by-law
  - (a) Street or Highway includes a common and public highway, street, avenue, parkway, driveway, square, place, bridge, viaduct or trestle, designed and intended for, or used by, the general public for the passage of vehicles.
  - (b) Boulevard shall mean the portion of the street allowance lying between the sidewalk and the roadway and on streets where there are no sidewalks it shall mean a portion of the road allowance lying between the travelled portion of the road and the limit of the allowance.
2. No person shall remove or cause to be removed snow from his own premises to the street, boulevard or highway in front of his said premises or to the street, highway or boulevard adjacent to his said premises or opposite to his said premises.
3. No person shall remove or cause to be removed snow from the street, boulevard or highway in front of his said premises on to the street, boulevard or highway adjacent thereto or opposite therefrom.
4. Procedures, Penalties and Voluntary Payment of Penalties
  - (a) The procedure to be used in dealing with Violators is as set out in Part II, Provincial Offences Act.
  - (b) Every person who violates any provision of this by-law is upon conviction guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine of not more than \$1,000, exclusive of costs, and all such penalties shall be recoverable under the Provincial Offences Act.
5. That this by-law hereby repeal By-Law No. 38 of 1960 and any amendments thereto.
